






 Decisions	Choices people make about what happens in their life. Some people may want support to make decisions.



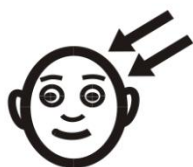
