Commitment

 The Group is committed to the protection of the environment. Responsibility

The business management systems and risk director is responsible for its effective and economic operation and development on a day-to-day basis.
- Project directors are responsible for incorporating environmental mitigation measures into projects, as agreed with customers.

Approach

• The Group aims to build all relevant environmental practices into its activities, and, as far as is reasonably practicable, energy and raw materials are drawn from sustainable and non-polluting sources and used effectively. The Group also aims to prevent pollution of any kind when conducting its activities. Environmental considerations are taken into account when procuring equipment, goods, materials and services for the Group. The Group is committed to recycling and reuse, as opposed to disposal, where feasible.

- The Group expects its employees and organisations and individuals working on its behalf to conduct their activities in an environmentally responsible manner. In all its activities the Group will endeavour to bring relevant environmental issues to its customers' attention. The aim is to seek environmental protection and improvement through the services provided by the Group.
